

## Reading Activities

Here are some reading activities you might like to try over the next few weeks.

- Create a word bank of interesting words that you come across in books and magazines. Find out what they mean so that you can try and use them.
- Collect some similes or metaphors that you could use in your writing next term.
- Write a letter to a character in a book. Think about what you would say to them. Maybe they need some motivation or a warning!
- Read a section of a non-fiction or fiction book and write some questions for someone else to answer about the passage.
- Make yourself a den and read in it.
- Try a different style of book, you might enjoy it!
- Listen to an audiobook.
- Write your own ending to a story.
- Draw some of your own illustrations to go with a story you are reading or a front cover.
- Draw and label a story map showing where the character visits. Add as much detail as you can.
- Create a poster to advertise a location that is in your book.
- Write a diary entry for one of your book characters. You could write one to show another character's viewpoint of the same event.
